

Student Expectations-School Closure: Spring 2020

- Students will access materials for the week each Sunday, or as quickly as they can get access to the internet, to plan out their weekly lessons.
 - **Students with internet access** will be able to access immediately following noon on Sundays.
 - Homework from students will be sent when completed to teachers by the following Sunday at noon.
 - Students can email or upload homework immediately and do not need to wait until Sunday to turn in homework.
 - **Students without internet access** will follow the district plan for allowing access.
 - Students have two district sponsored ways to access the internet.
 - 1. Drive up internet access outside of the FCS room in front of the electronic sign. Students and families will have 24 hour a day, 7 day a week access to the internet from this location.
 - Encouraged to stay in your car to download/upload.
 - 2. Students and families can request temporary internet access by contacting the high school office and setting up an appointment.
 - District will drive hotspots out to student homes to access the internet to upload or download materials.
 - District employees will also deliver any paper materials needed for students without internet access or have alternate assignments that require paper copies.
 - Office staff will organize with teachers.
 - Students will attend teacher office hours, if at all possible, to ask questions.
 - If students can not attend office hours, an email will work.
 - If a student does not have internet access, then the student will call the office to assist with setting up a time to work with the teacher on an individual Google Hangout with a call in option for the student. The internet is not needed, just a telephone or cell phone.
 - Students will give the best of their ability to homework and lesson plans.
 - They will continue to strive to work through these trying times and follow all lesson plan expectations from the teacher.
 - Students will also ask questions for teachers when they are unclear.
 - Students are encouraged to reach out to peers and study as a group when appropriate. Google Hangouts are unlocked for students that are able to access the internet.

- Students will turn all homework in a timely manner.
 - We understand that there will be struggles for some students with the distance learning format, but students must be participating weekly in the work.
- Students will contact their teacher first and the office second if they are having any kind of problems with a class. The classroom teacher needs to be able to address you first.
- Students will contact the office with technology issues or other concerns.
 - Computer or software issues can be directed to the office.
 - Any other concerns can be directed to the high school office or email the appropriate person, Mr. McLaughlin, Mrs. Yoder, Mrs. Sheriff.
- Students will care for their laptop and keep it charged and materials ready to go each day and week for homework.
- Students will get the appropriate amount of sleep and stick to a regular schedule for sleep that models an appropriate bedtime during the school year.
 - It is highly encouraged that students get 8-10 hours of sleep each night.
- Students will create a regular schedule for homework and other class work at home.
 - The schedule can adjust week to week, but students should have their week laid out, including approximately two hours per day of school work planned out in their day. More time must be allotted if they are a Kirkwood student.

- Students will interact appropriately with technology throughout the school week at home.
 - Google hangouts are an application for interacting with each other to focus on school work and to socialize in an appropriate way.
 - Any misuse of Google Hangouts or the laptop to bully, harass, any inappropriate materials being used or sent through our laptops is prohibited and will face district consequences.
- Students will be supportive of each other during any online group meetings, chats, assignments, etc...
 - As students sit at home, continuing their education, our work and expectations remain the same as if we were in school.
 - Appropriate language, interactions and discussions are expected as you utilize your school issued laptop for homework and socializing.
- Students will try their best.
 - The teachers and the school are doing the best that they can under the circumstances.
 - Students will help themselves and teachers by giving their best efforts.
